The \$156.9 million in added income was equal to approximately 2.6 percent of the region's Gross Regional Product in 2012-2013, according to an economic impact study conducted by Economic Modeling Specialists International, authorized by Texas Association of Community Colleges.

"The college spent \$24.3 million in operations in the region; students spent \$193,500; alumni – these are former students of ours – in a one-year period, contributed \$132.3 million... for a yearly impact of \$156.9 million," Gonzales said.

SWTJC president, Dr. Hector Gonzales received a one-year contract extension during the board meeting on Thursday (Jan. 15).


According to Board of Trustees President, Rodolfo Flores, Gonzales received an excellent evaluation during the executive session.

In a report to the SWTJC board at its regular monthly meeting, SWTJC Vice President of Student Services Margot Mata informed trustees on spring enrollment.




